5 easy steps to having an eye test

- 1..... Choose your Optician / Optometrist
- Contact them and tell them the appointment is for a person with a learning disability
- 3..... Ask the Optician / Optometrist as you may be eligible for an NHS funded eye test.
- 4..... Fill in SeeAbility's "Telling the Optometrist about me" form and give this to the Optician / Optometrist and before your appointment day if possible.
